




ADVENT SERIES

On Monday November 17, 2025, 102 Thanksgiving dinners were delivered from the Northern Illinois Food Bank. The holiday meal included a 10 to 16 lb. Whole Frozen Turkey or 4-6 lb turkey Breast, a box of fixings, a 5-pound bag of potatoes and a can of sweet potatoes (thanks to the generous folks at the Red Brick Inn). On that Monday, 81 of those

dinners were distributed in a "Turkey Drive Thru". Thank you to the volunteers who loaded the cars and a HUGE THANK YOU to everyone who donated money that allowed us to purchase the meals.

THANK YOU to everyone who donated Lip Balm in October! There were 406 tubes of lip balm! They were very much appreciated by the families who received them!




During the month of December, we are taking a break from Item of the Month collections for the pantry. Please support the Fire Department Christmas collections.

Memorial Garden Update

Marian Collins has been caring for our church garden for some ten years now. She has had some help along the way from Connie Worden for a few seasons, and others here and there. Somebody who's has been a church member longer should probably write about the origin and history of the space. While the original dedication of the garden was probably grand and hopeful at the time, the sustainability was perhaps not taken into account.

Marian has grown to enjoy her solitary time keeping up the garden. Some things have been added over the years and some things have been removed. Last January, we had the large honey locust tree trimmed for probably the first and last time. Locust trees are not ideal. Some arborists would even call them weed trees. Several service berry shrubs were removed and two large burning bush.

While serviceberry shrubs are typically lovely, native, showy plants, they were old and not doing well in the garden and had to go. Burning bush, on the other hand, is an invasive species that outcompetes native plants. Invasive plants, insects, fish and animals affect wildlife habitats and ecosystems. The two that were removed were also not doing well and Marian was happy to see them go. Two burning bush remain in the garden, but they were way overgrown and have been trimmed down to something more manageable. It's possible the trimming was done too late in their lifespan and too aggressively, but time will tell. This species continues to be popular for their bright red color for a few weeks in autumn.

The old crab tree that was in the middle of the garden was also removed last January. It had beautiful, little, pink spring flowers, but that was about it. Crab trees are also not ideal. It's a stubborn thing and continues to try to grow back through little sprouts (called suckers) coming through the roots. Marian will not allow this!

Several other large shrubs have been cut short over the past summer and fall. They are not invasive, but they had been allowed to grow out of control over time and were too tall to manage efficiently and safely. Where the crab tree and another burning bush once were, grass has been planted. Without a reliable water source, the grass was hard to keep up, but it's growing and will get stronger next spring. Marian plans to expand that grassy section while keeping all the showy perennial flowers that everybody loves. This small section of grass has made the garden a little easier for Marian to manage and she thinks she has a few years left in her.
