On the road to Jerusalem, Jesus witnessed to thousands.

Thousands — During the 4th of July Festival, Kirkland UMC volunteers witnessed through Christian hospitality to thousands as they passed by our church's "Refresh Station" and enjoyed our "Kids Zone." Each person was offered the hospitality of rest, prayer, and refreshment.





After giving the "Sermon on the Mount," Christ performed the miracle of feeding the 5,000.

\$ 2,200 received – The 4th of July Breakfast may not have served 5,000, but this year the serving area was filled to overflowing with breakfast guests, requiring the use of the nursery for additional tables and chairs. As with the miracle of the feeding of the 5000, our food supplies began to run out as the guests continued to arrive. However, even as we, like the disciples, feared we would be unable to feed everyone, we were blessed, and the food held out until the last guest was served.





The miracle of Pentecost arrived 40 days after Easter. People from different locations and backgrounds suddenly were able to worship together through the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Kirkland Food Pantry

During the first 6 months of 2025 the pantry has received an average of 147 visits per month. Those visits are made by an average of 81 unique households, which include an average of 293 unique individuals, 99 of whom are children. We can only do this with the continued support of the community. Thank you! If you have never seen the Food Pantry and would like to come and visit or just learn more about what we do, contact Clare

Update on produce: We received good news this month from our partners at Rooted For Good (formerly DeKalb County Community Gardens). The state will be providing money to continue the Local Food Purchase grant for 2 more months, which will provide us with locally grown produce during August and September. Rooted For Good has also been able to provide produce from a program called Farm to Food Bank. This program reimburses farmers for their costs for donating excess products to food pantries. Community members have begun providing us with produce from their gardens, which we greatly appreciate! Our neighbors love the fresh produce they find at the pantry!

If you or someone you know needs assistance providing food for their household, the pantry is open every Tuesday from 12:00 to 2:00 PM. We can help at other times if there is an emergency need for food, call Clare 815-978-2147.




Donating with the PayPal Giving Fund

Our fall class. "Paul's Epistles 1" will begin Sunday, September 14th

This Bible study of Paul's Letters, Part I, is a class designed for both beginners and advanced students. The class schedule will be segmented into 4-5 weeks of classes, followed by 2–3 weeks off. The class calendar allows new participants to enter at a time that works in their schedule and to skip a segment without losing their place when they resume.

Participants will need a Class book (\$14.00) and a dedicated Bible (a study Bible is recommended). Additionally, King James and New King James Bibles are not suitable for use in this class, as they can be challenging to read. A different translation is recommended. The following translations are suggested: Common English Bible, New Revised Standard Version, New International Version, New Living Translation, or other translations with which you are comfortable reading.

Books will be ordered for you through Cokesbury, unless you prefer to purchase your copy. The deadline for Kirkland UMC ordering class books is August 17th. The book order will be placed that day. After August 17th, you will be responsible for obtaining your book. Sign-ups will be available through email and at the church.
