#### **Pastor's Corner**

#### Happy Summer to all:

"As it is, however, there still remains for God's people a rest like God's resting on the seventh day. For those who receive that rest which God promised will rest from their own work, just as God rested from His. Hebrews 4: 9-10 Good News Bible.

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy Labor Day! For all federal and many non-federal workers Monday, September 2nd, Labor Day, is a day for rest and relaxation. For those in retail, however, it's a madhouse! We find the idea of resting multiple times in the Scriptures. Jesus says in Matthew 11: 28, "Come to me, all of you who are tired from carrying heavy loads, and I will give you rest." And in the above passage from the Epistle to the Hebrews, the author tells his congregations, "... to rest like God's resting on the seventh day."

Why then do we as God's people forget to rest? Many use their Sabbath Day, traditionally Sunday, to catch up on housework, work from home, or run errands; leaving us to be more exhausted on Monday morning than the previous Friday evening.

Labor Day was started by union workers to celebrate the benefits of unionized labor. A major goal of the early unions was to make a mandatory day of rest become law. In the early 20 th century, many laborers worked 12+ hours seven days a week. It was a reason to celebrate when laws were written to protect the workers from such harsh conditions.

This day or weekend should be celebrated. It should be a day of doing what gives you rest, whether that's gardening, shopping, reading, binge-watching TV, having a barbeque with family and friends, or doing nothing at all. Cherish this 3-day weekend as a time to refresh yourself.

Rest is a gift from God. We need to remember that even God took a Sabbath Day, to rest. Many of us, myself included, are unable to use Sunday as our Sabbath day because of commitments that must be met. That leaves us 7 days to choose one to be our Sabbath. A day of resting and reflecting on our lives and our lives with God at the center.

If you are like me, an entire day off is many times unreasonable, then choose a set number of hours on a specific day as your Sabbath time of rest. Mine is Monday morning until Noon. The rest of Monday is for household chores. Do you have a day or a specific number of hours each week to use for rest? Can you carve out time for your physical, mental, and spiritual health?

God calls us to rest. God takes care of us and calls us to take care of ourselves. Rest well!

## New appointment for Bishop Dan Schwerin

As of September 1, 2024, Bishop Schwerin will preside over the newly yoked conferences of Northern Illinois -Wisconsin. The conferences remain separate and independent with Bishop Schwerin overseeing both.

In May, the UMC denomination's International Legislative Assembly voted to cut the number of active U.S. bishops from 39 to 32. Most Jurisdictions have realigned their episcopal area boundaries to allow for a smaller number of bishops, and some are planning to share bishops across jurisdictional lines.

Northern Illinois-Wisconsin conference is part of the North Central jurisdiction. Within this jurisdiction, 4 conferences have been yoked to cut our conference number from 9 to 7: Dakotas-Minnesota and Northern Illinois-Wisconsin.

Note the gold in this updated photo. Diane discovered tarnished gold rather than black paint when she was cleaning the back of the window.


Last month we reported the window's bowing when she flipped it over. Correcting this is a laborious, tricky thing. Mike Pera and Eric Mede are still studying the problem and how to best drill holes into the wood so the braces could be anchored and keep the window straight.

Eric Mede's glue and epoxy have filled the cracks. They have one small hole to still work on.
